

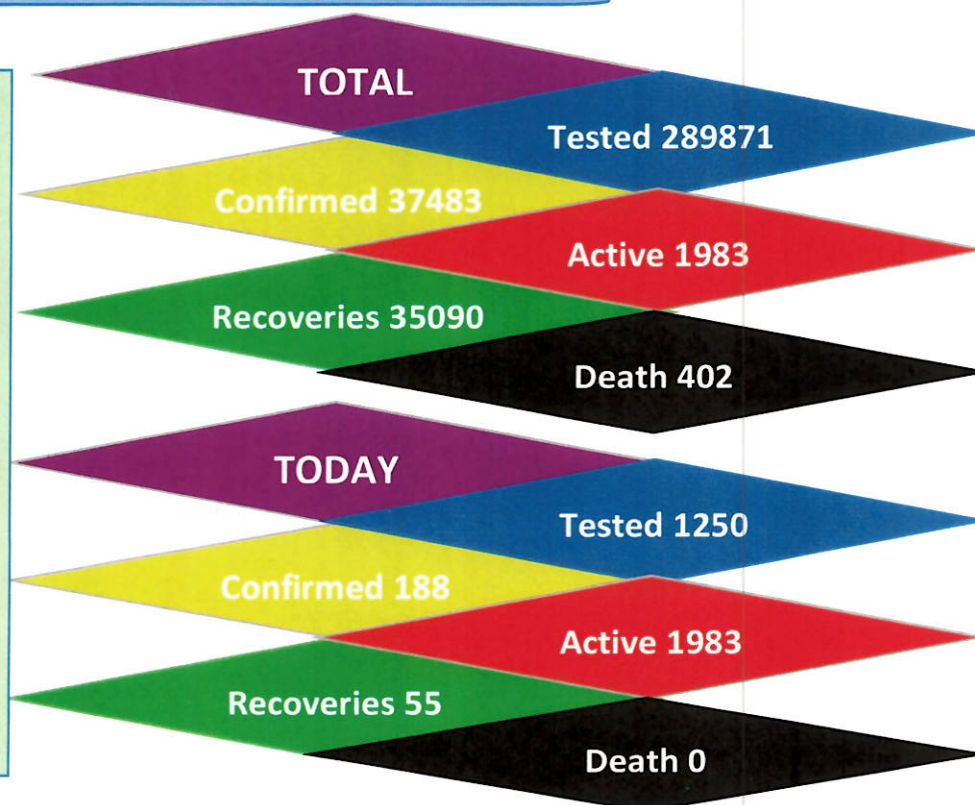

HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (20/02/2021)

- A total of **37483** cases have been recorded to-date, representing **1%** of the population.
- More male cases **19075 (51%)** were recorded compared to female cases **18408 (49%)**.
- Of the total confirmed cases, **1714 (5%)** Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 1323 (77%) State; 383 (22%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1648 (96%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at **94%**.

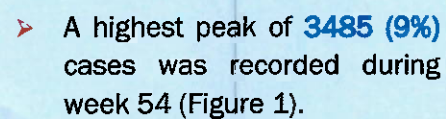


- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with **14981 (40%)** and **7325 (20%)** respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, **319 (79%)** are COVID-19 deaths while **83 (21%)** are COVID-19 related deaths.

- To date, **289871** tests (including **11485** re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, **68000** contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, **13** new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 9 regions.
- Cumulatively, **63377** contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of **9078 (24%)** contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, **2109 (49%)** out of **4261** active contacts monitored.

- Of the total confirmed cases, **25105 (67%)** are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **5242 (14%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make **857 (2%)** of the total cases whereas, **2369 (6%)** are above 60 years of age.

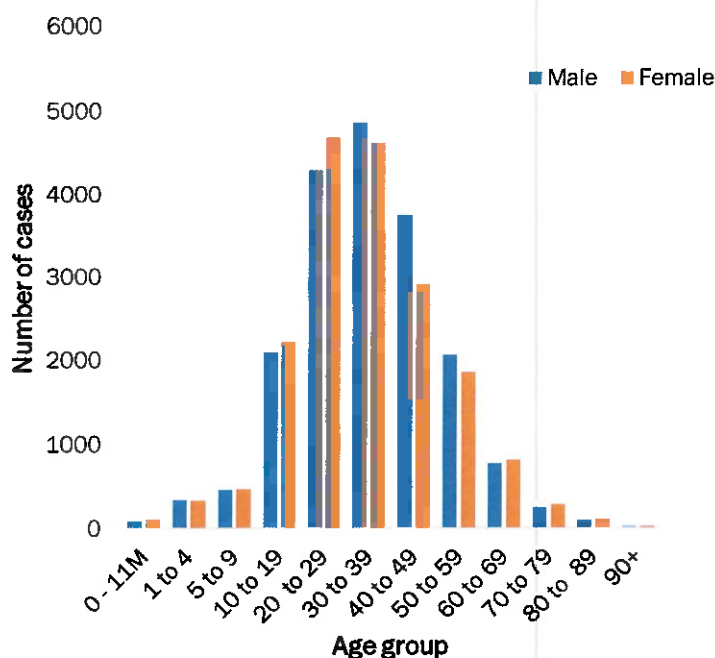


Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 20 February 2021

- A total of **2186** people are currently in quarantine, with **68** new admissions.

- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise the continuation of essential health services.

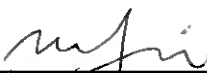
CHALLENGES

- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

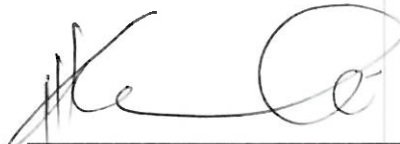
RECOMMENDATIONS
