Okaukuejo first opened as a tourist rest camp in 1955. Its original spelling, Okakwiju, meant "the woman who has a child every year", or a prolific woman. The flood-lit water-hole, where animals can be viewed as they come to drink 24 hours a day, is one of Etosha's major attractions.
